





Total Homicides 2013-2017 YTD


- There have been 37 victims of homicide in the City of Edmonton year to date in 2017.
- This is slightly higher than the number of homicides by this time in 2016, which was 33.
- Therefore it is reasonable to suggest that by the end of 2017, the number of homicides will increase by year end.




























Homicides by Location, Date & Time

- In 2017, homicides
 were almost exactly
 split between daytime
 and non daytime
 hours.
- In 2017, the days of the week for homicides are fairly evenly spread out.





Other Files & Work

- In 2017 Homicide Section conducted a number of "other" investigations that were not deemed to be homicides for various reasons.
- There were 39 "Other Investigations" handled by Homicide Section in 2017. Often times these files are equally or even more resource taxing than a traditional homicide file.
- Some investigations may eventually be categorized as homicides while others may not and therefore are never reflected in the homicide statistics.
- Homicide Section also recently started a new project in 2017, which will involve extensive investigations.
