	2.1	Acknowledgement of Treaty Six Territory	
		Chair Ruth opened the meeting with the following acknowledgement:	
		"The Edmonton Police Commission acknowledges the traditional land on which we are gathered today, is on Treaty 6 Territory. I would like to thank the diverse Indigenous Peoples whose ancestors' footsteps have marked this territory for centuries such as: Nehiyaw (Cree), Dene, Anishnaabe (Saulteaux), Nakota Sioux and Niitsitapi (Blackfoot) peoples. We also acknowledge this as the Métis homeland and the home of one of the largest concentrations of Inuit south of the 60th parallel. It is a welcoming place for all peoples who come from around the world to share Edmonton as a home. Together we call upon all of our collective, honoured traditions and spirits to work in building a great city for today and future generations."

	2.3 <u>National Police Week</u>	
	Chair Ruth advised that May 9-15, 2021 was National Police Week. The theme this year was "Working Together to Keep Our Communities Safe". On behalf of the Commission she thanked all those who serve with the Edmonton Police Service for their dedication and in keeping our communities safe especially through these challenging times.	
	2.4 Recognition of International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia & Biphobia	
	Vice-Chair McDougall advised that May 17, 2021 was the International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia and Biphobia. This year's theme "For some, showing their colours isn't a choice" highlights that many LGBTQ2S+ people continue to suffer high rates of harassment, bullying and violent crimes. The date was chosen to commemorate the World Health Organization's decision in 1990 to declassify homosexuality as a mental disorder.	
	He advised that the Commission stands with the LGBTQ2S+ community in condemning hate and discrimination and reaffirms the right of every individual to be treated equally, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity. She added that the Edmonton Police Service will raise the LGBTQ2S+ Inclusive Pride flag on June 16, 2021.
