Top Five Crash Causes in Edmonton



Speed and Distraction

Crash reports contain information on when, where and how a crash happened. They do not include police major investigation information, such as unsafe speed, impairment or distraction. **Speed is a factor in every crash** by impacting both the likelihood and severity.


Crash Reduction by Mode

Good News→

Crashes involving motor vehicle occupants have been decreasing.

Bad News→

Crashes involving other road users aren't decreasing at the same rate.

80% of all serious injury and fatality crashes are the result of a driver error.

Drivers running red lights and failing to comply with traffic signals.

High Injury Network



The High Injury Network is a mapping tool that shows us which stretches of roads have the highest concentration of crashes for each mode of travel.





Equity Analysis Findings

15 of our neighbourhoods are exposed to the majority of serious injury and fatality crashes.

10% of Edmontonians live in these neighbourhoods.


Based on Census data, we know that a higher than average number of Low-income households, Indigenous Peoples, and linguistic minorities call these parts of Edmonton home.

As a result, they are exposed to higher numbers of fatal and serious injury crashes by virtue of where they live in Edmonton.

Our systems contribute to inequity.

311 and POSSE complaints/inquiries are main drivers for conducting site assessments and adding/prioritizing locations to work plans.

We're not hearing from the equity-seeking communities whose neighbourhoods need the most attention, driving inequity in our work.


Strategic Collaboration with EPS

Support strategic location selection and scheduling of EPS in-person traffic enforcement and City-led mobile automated enforcement through data collection and analysis.












Strategic Collaboration with EPS

- Exploring new technologies for data collection and future automated enforcement options (ie: distracted driving).
- Enhanced joint communications and media presence and integration at City Council.
- Increased collaboration in key initiatives, projects, and Council-driven work (ie: Safe Mobility Strategy development, 40 km/h default speed limit).
- Partner on work directed by Government of Alberta (Justice Transformation Initiative, Automated Traffic Enforcement Guidelines Review).

Traffic Safety Automated Enforcement Reserve

2022 Forecast Deficit: \$11M

Current Impacts

- COVID: \$12.5M (2020/2021)
- GOA Revenue Share: Additional \$9M/year
- EPS Share: \$22M/year
- Provincial Automated Enforcement Moratorium
