		Chair McDougall opened the meeting with the following acknowledgement:	
		"The Edmonton Police Commission acknowledges the traditional land on which we are gathered today, is on Treaty 6 Territory. I would like to thank the diverse Indigenous Peoples whose ancestors' footsteps have marked this territory for centuries such as: Nehiyaw (Cree), Dene, Anishnaabe (Saulteaux), Nakota Sioux and Niitsitapi (Blackfoot) peoples. We also acknowledge this as the Métis homeland and the home of one of the largest concentrations of Inuit south of the 60th parallel. It is a welcoming place for all peoples who come from around the world to share Edmonton as a home. Together we call upon all of our collective, honoured traditions and spirits to work in building a great city for today and future generations."	
	2.2	2022 Alberta Community Justice Award Chair McDougall recognized and congratulated the Edmonton Police Service and their Human-Centred Engagement & Liaison Partnership (HELP) for receiving an Alberta Community Justice award in the category of innovation.

	These awards are given to individuals and groups who have found ways to prevent crime and promote restorative justice in their towns and cities.	
	The HELP program is a collaboration between constables and civilian "navigators" that direct community members to service providers and helps them avoid further entrenchment in the criminal justice system.	
2.3	Kiwanis Top Cop	
	Chair McDougall congratulated Constable Daniel Tallack for receiving the Kiwanis Top Cop award in 2021 for his extensive efforts mentoring and supporting vulnerable 2SLGBTQ+ youth at local drop-in centres and shelters who are facing houselessness, addictions or mental health crises. His lived experience as a member of the 2SLGBTQ+ community and understanding of the barriers they face, helped him develop empathy and compassion as a police officer, and build positive relationships and trust with community members. Const. Daniel Tallack is the 46th Edmonton Police Service officer recognized by Kiwanis for outstanding volunteer contributions in the community since 1976. Kiwanis is a	
	global organization of volunteers dedicated to changing the world one child and one community at a time.
