	Staff Sergeant Tassone spoke to what is being presented, adding that all incidents involving force are reported in compliance with Use of Force Guidelines outlined in the Provincial Policing Standards.  He spoke to the  Report Process – statistics collected for January to June 2022  Use of Force Statistics for 2020, 2021 and 2022 (Q1 & Q2)  Category I (minor in nature) and II (higher level use of force) Control Tactic Reports  Staff Sergeant Tassone and Chief of Staff Krikler responded to questions.	

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	In response to Commissioner Calahoo-Stonehouse, Chief of Staff Krikler advised that the Service can include race data matrix and gender demographics in its next presentation to the Commission.	EPS
8.	CHIEF OF POLICE REPORT	
	8.1 <u>Key Issues</u>	
	<ul> <li>A/Chief Laforce highlighted the following:</li> <li>The videos that were widely circulated last week regarding an arrest made in the area of 100 Street and 106 Avenue resulted in speculation and significantly impacted an officer who was wrongly identified as being the officer involved in the incident. He provided a more informative video clip and spoke to the incident, adding that charges were not laid against the individual involved who was fed a meal and released. He advised that following the tragedies that have occurred in the downtown communities, the Service is working with City of Edmonton and partners to stand up initiatives to address the very real and serious safety issues.</li> <li>On behalf of the Edmonton Police Service he extended sympathies to the Toronto Police Service and the family of the Toronto Police Service officer who was laid to rest after being gunned down eating his lunch in his patrol car.</li> <li>September 25, 2022 Alberta's Fallen Officers will be honoured at the Alberta Legislative Grounds.</li> <li>September 14, 2022 an Edmonton Police Service member was struck by a motorcycle and sustained non-life-threatening injuries and remains in hospital. He thanked members of the community for coming forward with tips on assisting to locate the motorcycle. The investigation is still continuing.</li> <li>The Service supported several civilian and sworn women members in attending the International Association of Women's Police Conference held in Niagara and the Women Leaders in Law Enforcement Training Symposium held in San Diego last week. He thanked the Beverly MacLean Legacy Fund for sending one of the women and the Commission for the support with the Superintendent Deb Jolly Memorial Fund for another.</li> <li>Between August 28 and September 5, 2022 the Service responded to 10 shootings, including 5 over</li> </ul>	

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	<ul> <li>the long weekend. It is believed all shootings were targeted events, several of which posed a safety risk to the public due on their locations.</li> <li>As of September 5, 2022 the Service has responded to 105 shootings, of which 53% resulted in injury and 63% posed a potential risk for innocent bystanders.</li> <li>As of August 31, 2022 the Service seized approximately 452 firearms.</li> </ul>
