RISK

Level of Service must be proportionate to Level of Risk to reoffend

NEED

Service providers target and address criminogenic needs to reduce an offender's risk to reoffend.


(Basic vs. Criminogenic)

- Are tailored to address offenderspecific conditions


Central 8 Criminogenic Risk/Needs (Andrews & Bonta, 2010)



Influenced by our **RELATIONSHIP** with the offender


Offender Demographics (Race/Gender)









Key takeaways



- IOM sweet spot in case management = 10 months
- Enforcement is a key proponent of desistance of P&P offender's crime
- Navigation services in concert with enforcement reduces harm more significantly than enforcement alone
- Transportation is a key responsivity factor in offender success
- Lack of available data and records management across Police, Social Service Ministries, and NGOs made this study challenging

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
