We also acknowledge this as the Métis homeland and the home of one of the largest concentrations of Inuit south of the 60th parallel. It is a welcoming place for all peoples who come from around the world to share Edmonton as a home. Together we call upon all of our collective, honoured traditions and spirits to work in building a great city for today and future generations."

	A written report was provided to the Commission. Chief McFee provided updates on several key issues:	
	 Notable reduction in the number of shootings in 2024, with January 2024 experiencing a 53% decrease. 	
	 Discussed 34 incidents of extortion, emphasizing the involvement of local, national, and international groups. 	
	 Mentioned 6 arrests made and highlighted community outreach efforts. 	
	 Recognized the EPS' Employee and Organizational Wellness Branch for their efforts. 	
	Collaborated with City, Provincial and community partners to provide services at the Navigation Support Centre.	

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	 Noted the effective collaboration between EPS teams and partners in addressing homelessness and providing support. Highlighted the dangers posed by the encampments such as the Whyte Avenue area apartment fire. Recognition of Black History Month with events organized by the Community Relations Section. Mentioned the one-year anniversary of Constable's Travis Jordan and Brett Ryan and expressed plans for a ceremony. Chief McFee and Deputy Chief Driechel responded to questions from the commissioners.
