Together we call upon all of our collective, honoured traditions and spirits to work in building a great city for today and future generations."	
	1. In Memoriam Chris Skaggs: Chair Ambtman spoke on the passing of Chris, the longtime clerk of the Edmonton Police Commission, who died on October 31 <sup>st</sup> , after a short battle with cancer. Chair Ambtman described Chris as the heart of the commission, highlighting her long-serving role and the impact she had on her colleagues.

	6.1 Integrated Offender Management (IOM)	
	Insp. Graham Hogg, Sgt. Renee Martynuik and Megan Wells presented the report. Some key points were:	

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<ul> <li>IOM focuses on the top 10% of prolific and persistent offenders in Edmonton</li> <li>Study was conducted from January 1st to August 15th</li> <li>Evidence Base: Risk Need Responsivity</li> <li>Offenders demographics is typically aged 20 to 50, with at least three criminal convictions</li> <li>Transportation is a key responsivity factor in offender success</li> <li>Lack of available data and records management across Police, Social Service Ministries, and NGOs made this study challenging</li> <li>Insp. Hogg, Sgt. Martynuik, Chief McFee, and COO/Chief of Staff Okere responded to questions and comments from the</li> </ul>	
commissioners.	
<ul> <li>6.2 Healthy Streets Operation Centre (HSOC) Report</li> <li>Deputy Chief Darren Derko introduced Inspector Angela Kemp and Staff Sergeant Michael Dreilich.</li> <li>Inspector Kemp and S/Sgt Dreilich presented a follow-up to the May 2023 HSOC report. They highlighted the following: <ul> <li>HSOC aims to address high crime areas in Edmonton, particularly the downtown core, Chinatown and Kingsway zones based on data indicating high severity of crime and harm.</li> <li>Joint Governance Committee included members of EPS, Homeward Trust, Reach Edmonton, AHS, Bent Arrow Traditional Healing Society and the City of Edmonton.</li> <li>Joint Leadership Committee consists of Director, Superintendent, and Inspector.</li> <li>HSOC team currently operates two teams from Monday to Friday, extending to three teams with seven-day coverage in January and four teams in May 2024.</li> <li>Teams spend an average of 700 hours per month in community safety zones.</li> <li>HSOC activities balance enforcement, crime management and stakeholder/community engagements</li> <li>Encampment interactions increased in the summer months and the EPS supports the City's encampment strategy</li> <li>381 Ambulances Deferred, 647 Patients attended by HSOC</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

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	<ul> <li>HSOC area residents are feeling more safe walking alone after dark and safer alone on Transit</li> <li>City of Edmonton, EPS and HSOC Governance are working to develop a community health measure where they can determine when a community has recovered and is no longer in need of HSOC interventions</li> <li>Chief McFee, Deputy Chief Derko, Inspector Kemp and Staff Sergeant Dreilich responded to questions.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>He addressed public concerns about gang-related shootings and efforts to address gang-related violence.</li> <li>Recruit graduation with 35 new constables and 49 currently in training.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Organizational Wellness Branch announced a partnership with Wounded Warriors Canada that will offer innovative mental health programs and services to EPS members and their families.</li> </ul>
