

#### **FOCUS AREAS:**

O1 FOCUSED DETERRENCE

- Use specific deterrence measures to impact the criminogenic lifestyle
- Engage the community as a partner

02 INVESTIGATIVE EXCELLENCE

- Focus investigative resources on the highest harm offenders
- Train frontline resources to improve overall investigative quality

YOUNG PEOPLE INTERVENTION

- Offer appropriate diversion options
- Support the right social agencies
- Engage the community as a partner

## **Outcome and Measures**

#### **Outcome**

Gun and gang activity in Edmonton is reduced to enhance the safety of communities.

#### **Measures**

- 1. Increased solve rate on non-fatal gang-related shooting occurrences
- 2. Increase in rate of convictions for users of firearms, drug traffickers and firearms traffickers
- 3. Decrease in proportion of gang-related homicides
- 4. Decrease in rate of growth for firearms-related offences

## Our Action Plan: What we have done

## 1. FOCUSED DETERRENCE

O1 Stood up a second Gang Suppression Team

Developed the Gang Response and Intelligence Program (GRiP)

Conducted multiple investigative projects

## Our Action Plan: What we have done

## 2 INVESTIGATIVE EXCELLENCE

- Bolstered the Firearms Investigation Unit (FIU) with 3 members
- O2 Piloted a new Firearms Compliance Unit (FCU)

O3 Created the Drug Expert Investigations Team (DEIT)

O4 Conducted multiple complex investigations

## Our Action Plan: What we have done

## 3. YOUNG PEOPLE INTERVENTION

- 01
- Created GAP19, a justice referred day program that targets the highest risk youth (12 -18 years old)

- 02
- Participated in the governance committee for the Building Safer Communities Fund (BSCF)

- 03
- **Supported Bent Arrow Traditional Healing Society to implement the Indigenous Mentorship Program**

## Some results in 2023

### **Guns & Gangs Section and EDGE Section Only**

### **FOCUSED DETERRENCE**

 3 successful outcomes in court: guilty plea, guilty verdict and pending guilty verdict in firearms related charges

#### INVESTIGATIVE EXCELLENCE

- 9 successful convictions in court for shootings and firearms trafficking charges
- 2 homicides solved



### YOUNG PEOPLE INTERVENTION

- Alberta Correctional Services approved for youth mentors to meet young people in custody.
- 30 youth referrals to the Gap19 program

# We have experienced a positive trend in the past two months

### 3-Year Trend of Shootings in Edmonton (2022 -2024)



Key Trend Statistics	Dec '22	Dec '23	(vs PY)		Jan '23	Jan '24	(Vs PY)
# of Shootings	21	17	-19%	-	19	9	-53%
# of people injured or killed by a firearm	17	10	- 41%	•	13	6	-54%
# of firearms related homicides	5	0	-100%	•	3	0	-100%
# of seized firearms & airguns	161	192	+19%	•	141	164	+16%

Leverage 2 GST teams for 7 days/week coverage and proactive policing of gang related subjects



Leverage Bill C-48 to keep violent offenders off the streets



Establish Mentorship & Gang Solutions (MAGS) to address at risk youth
